



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 10
Series of 2020

"AN ORDER CREATING THE LOCAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF PALO, LEYTE"

WHEREAS, the State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual and social well-being;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 10742 otherwise known as the SK Reform Act of 2015 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations states that to ensure wide and multi-sectoral youth participation in local governance, there shall be a Municipal Youth Development Council in every municipality;

WHEREAS, Municipal Ordinance No. 2004-04 "An Ordinance Creating the Local Youth Development Council of the Municipality of Palo, Leyte" provides for the establishment of a local youth development council which shall be responsible for the formulation of policies and implementation of youth development programs, projects and activities of the municipality;

WHEREAS, NOW THEREFORE, I, FRANCES ANN B. PETILLA, Municipal Mayor of Palo, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby order:

Section 1. Composition. The Local Youth Development Council shall be composed of the following:

Presiding Officer: SK Pederasyon President

Members: SK Pederasyon Vice President

At least eight (8) but not more than nineteen (19) representatives of the different registered Youth Organizations (YOs) or Youth-Serving Organizations (YSOs) in the municipal level, provided that all other incumbent SK officials shall not be eligible as member of the LYDC.

Section 2. Functions. The Local Youth Development Council shall perform the following functions:

- a.) Serve as the core of the advocacy on youth participation in nation-building and youth empowerment;
- b.) Finalize the three (3) year LYDP that is anchored in the Philippine Youth Development Plan and the development plans of the local government units. The LYDP shall be initially drafted by the respective SK Pederasyon and shall be finalized by the LYDC. This shall be submitted to the LCE for inclusion in the Local Development Plan and subsequently endorsed to the Sanggunian of the local government unit concerned for approval. These plans shall give priority to programs, projects and activities that will promote and ensure the meaningful youth participation in nation-building, sustainable youth development and empowerment, equitable access to quality education, environmental protection, climate change adaptation, disaster risk reduction and resiliency, youth employment and livelihood, health and anti-drug abuse, gender sensitivity, social protection, capability building and sports development;
- c.) Monitor and evaluate the implementation of the Local Youth Development Plan; and
- d.) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed by law or ordinance.

Section 3. Meetings. The LYDC shall schedule a meeting every quarter, and as often as needed. However, if the president or the vice president of the SK Pederasyon of the Province/City/Municipality fails to convene the LYDC as scheduled, at least one-third of the total membership of the LYDC may call for a meeting. In both instances, a written notice shall be sent, either through traditional or non-traditional means, to all members setting the date, time, place and agenda of the meeting which must be received at least two (2) days in advance(2). The presence of the majority of all members of the LYDC shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. Repealing Clause. All orders, issuances, and rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with this Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 5. Effectivity. This Order shall take effect immediately.
